Dr David Low – Environmental Scientist, Monash University,

Melbourne Monash University environmental scientist and The Weed's Network founder Dr David Low is passionate about a sustainable, viable and creative future in our relationship with weeds.



Dr. Low believes that through a spirit of willing exploration we can foster ways to better understand weeds, so they become a resource we can manage with environment and future generations in mind. The Weed's Network provides evidence-based information for innovative ways of thinking about, engaging with and managing weeds sustainably. The Weed's Network publishes fortnightly newsletters as well as an on-line Sustainable Weeding Guide which is a leading resource for learning about sustainable options for living with and working with weeds. The guide covers a wide range of weed issues including Cultural Management, Revegetation Management, Organic Weed Management, Crop Specific Weed Management, Herbicides and much more. Dr Low recently shared the stage with Allan Savory (Holistic Management) and Major General Michael Jeffery (Advocate for Soil Health) at the 'Day After Tomorrow' conference where he presented 'Making Money from Weeds'.

Local producers and innovative thinkers over the course of the three days:

Utilising African Lovegrass with supplements, an example from 'Narayen', Mundubbera. A simple trial with 25 breeders on African Lovegrass with supplements, versus 25 breeders on native and improved pastures.

Managing pastures as a whole, including the weed species, an example from Monto. Growing pastures and learning to live with weeds. Treating weeds with non-chemical applications.

Using Camels to manage weeds, an example from Booubyjan. Camels are increasingly being recognised for their use in the grazing market; here they've been put to work with Cats Claw Creeper and other weeds.
